A Message from the President



There is a well-known saying which states that “a week is a long time in politics” (“Sayings of the Century”, 1949). Who in our lifetime could have contemplated the extension of that saying into a “day is a long time in World History”. The unimaginable events on the Eastern Seaboard of America have touched nearly all of the global population. Expressions of sympathy for our American colleagues have poured into Central Office, and the warmth of their content and a helpless desire to reach out and offer support have touched us all.

I stated in my address in Chiba how proud I was to be President of our Association,

My own Presidential travel plans are laid, and I will fulfill all my obligations. I attended the Continental European Division meeting at the beginning of September in Rome so ably organized by Professor Guido Goracci. Here I was accompanied by John Clarkson, our President-elect, and by Stephen Challacombe, our Vice-president, thus ensuring a major IADR presence in the Eternal City. I offer my congratulations to incoming CED President Dominique Deville de Périère.

I will be attending the Argentine Division Meeting in Tucuman in October, and I look forward to supporting the exciting dental research strategies being formulated within South America. Attendance at the UK Research Assessment Exercise in Clinical Dentistry, together with my newly acquired Dean's duties, prevented my attendance at the NOF Scandinavian Division in Copenhagen, although I was pleased that our Vice-president, Stephen Challacombe, was able to attend in his joint capacity as President of the British Division. Since our Chief Executive, Eli Schwarz, also attended, they were able to report on a highly successful scientific meeting.

Life must go on, and we must not be daunted. We are a truly global community. Let us make every effort to keep it that way, both for our contributions to worldwide oral health programs, and for the furtherance of dental research as a highly respected scientific discipline.

Division Meeting Success!

The 18th Annual Meeting of the IADR Brazilian Division (SBPqO) took place September 1-5, 2001, in Aguas de Lindoia in the São Paulo state of Brazil. IADR Executive Director Eli Schwarz and Web/Database Coordinator Denise Setliff traveled to the meeting to discuss the benefits of IADR membership with the participants.

The meeting drew over 3,000 registrants from throughout the country; nearly all of the dental schools in Brazil were represented. The over 1,600 poster presentations, 31 competing for the Hatton Award alone, stimulated intense scientific discussions during the meeting.

The meeting focused on young researchers and encouraged contributions from this group. The volunteer efforts of the Brazilian Division officers, led by Division President Jose Luis Lage-Marques, provided an excellent atmosphere of learning and networking for the Division members. Dr. Schwarz led two seminars concerning abstract submission, specifically demonstrating the IADR on-line submission process, www.dental

research.org, to encourage researchers to use this method for submissions. Additionally, the IADR was given booth space on the exhibition floor to discuss the membership benefits of the IADR, and recruited many new members for the Association. The meeting provided a unique opportunity for those from the Central Office to meet many of the members of the Brazilian Division, and all participants were encouraged by the spirit of and support for dental research in evidence throughout the meeting.

Scandinavian Division Holds Annual Meeting in Copenhagen

The 84th Annual Meeting of the Scandinavian Association for Dental Research (NOF) took place in Copenhagen, Denmark, at the Faculty of Health Sciences, Panum Institute, where the busy schedule prevented most of the approximately 250 participants from enjoying the wonderful Scandinavian summer days. In addition to the traditional symposium, oral, and poster sessions (around 100 abstracts), the Division had organized a two-day research seminar on oral diagnostics, targeted at junior researchers and subsidized by the Joint Committee of the Nordic Medical Research Councils, and a program on How to Write a Successful Grant Application, with input from the Medical Research Councils in London and in Bonn. Several IADR issues were discussed by the Board with regard to present and future developments from both the Scandinavian and the European perspectives. The presence of IADR Executive Director **Eli Schwarz** during the first days and of IADR Vice-president **Stephen Challacombe**, at the end, gave a good opportunity for exchanging views on future IADR strategies. At the General Assembly, **Peter Lingström**, Göteborg, was elected as the incoming President, to succeed **Birgitte Nauntofte** in January, 2002.

Call for Applications-- 2002 Giddon Award

The Executive Committee of the Behavioral Sciences & Health Services Research Group of IADR announces the Giddon Award for Distinguished Research in the Behavioral Sciences. This award recognizes a single research paper published or accepted for publication in the current calendar year or in the calendar year prior to the current one in the fields of social or cultural anthropology, education, psychology, psychiatry, sociology, or social work applied to dentistry. Both applied and basic research papers are eligible. The Award committee will accept self-nominations or nominations by others until **November 30, 2001**. The paper should be accompanied by a brief letter describing why it is deemed worthy of an award. Manuscripts accepted for publication but not yet published should be accompanied by a copy of the acceptance letter from the journal editor. Nominations will be acknowledged by e-mail or in writing. The award is made annually, provided a meritorious paper is nominated. It is made possible by a contribution from Donald B. Giddon, DMD, PhD, a founder and former President of the BSHSR Group. Preferably, one of the primary authors of the manuscript selected for the award, or someone on his/her behalf, is expected to attend the award ceremony at the IADR meeting in San Diego. The senior author will receive the prize, but all of the authors will be recognized.

People & Places

National media have been reporting on two papers authored by Paffenbarger Research Center (PRC) scientists and presented recently at the American Chemical Society meeting in Chicago, http://dailynews.yahoo.com/h/nm/20010827/hl/cavities_1.html. The papers are amorphous calcium phosphate “smart composites”, co-invented by IADR members **Drago Skrtic** of the PRC and **Joseph Antonucci** of the National Institute of Standards and Technology, and pulp-capping composites, invented by IADR member **Sabine Dickens** of the PRC. Both of these promising new materials are expected to reach dental offices within the next two years.

IADR member Lorne M. Golub (Stony Brook University) is the winner of the 2001 American Dental Association Norton M. Ross Award for Excellence in Clinical Research. He was recognized for his significant contributions to the understanding of periodontal disease and the development of new therapies for this and several systemic disease through a pharmacological approach involving enzyme inhibition.

IADR member and Immediate Past President Marjorie Jeffcoat (University of Alabama, Birmingham) has been named the first woman editor of the Journal of the American Dental Association. Her appointment was the culmination of an 11-month search, and she was selected from a field of nearly two dozen candidates.

IADR member George Zarb (University of Toronto) recently received the Thaddeus V. Weclaw Fellowship from the Academy of General Dentistry, for his exceptional contributions to the art and science of dentistry and the promotion of the Academy’s principles and ideals.
